This exhibition, organised and produced by CentroCentro, explores the ruins of modern European infrastructures with 141 pieces (prints, books, paintings, photographs, videos and documents) by over a hundred artists spanning from the 16th century until now.

The project approaches ruins and ruination as a tool and a language through which to read Europe's history and memory against its grain. Ruins are here understood not only as the result of material and symbolic erosion or destruction but also in their expressive dimension: as narrative elements that can be recombined into new stories, bearing witness and acting as an index to past events as well as conceivable future events; a commodity that supports different ideologies, and a fragment full of possibilities.

The exhibition is articulated through four different but interconnected sections: *Nature / Culture/Body* surveys the construction of an ideal canon, as well as the nature and culture divide; *Infrastructure* refers to the institutional fabric that organises, produces and governs the idea of Europe; *Superstructure* investigates how the territory is produced and arranged; *Destruction/Repair* looks at the ruins resulting from war as well as iconoclasm, reconstruction and memory.

The exhibition follows the logic of Warburg's atlas of images, displaying an anachronistic visual collection which invites the observer to recombine it and create their own discourse. "This exhibition doesn't tell nor demonstrates", signal the curators. "It presents a discontinuous, incomplete tale of Europe with the potential to be rewritten and reimagined".
